Work in Progress and Under Review

“Prisoners of the Past: Historical narratives as heuristics in international decision-making”

Draft working paper and draft grant application. Building on insights from behavioral economics and social psychology about narratives as availability heuristics, this paper uses survey experiments in order to gauge potential effects of historical narratives on elites’ and citizens’ preferences for reciprocity.

“Negotiating with your mouth full: Informal governance and lunches in EU politics”

Draft working paper. This paper asks to what extent governments substitute informal governance for official procedures when these are increasingly formalized. It uses a novel dataset of Council agendas and minutes in order to gauge whether stricter transparency rules led to a shift of deliberations among EU governments from official venues to more secluded informal lunches, at which no minutes are taken.

“The guardrails of multilateralism”

Draft book proposal. Building on recent work in American and Comparative Politics on polarization as well as my previous work on the informal governance, this book seeks to show that for multilateral institutions to work, they must be embedded in informal norms about (1) states’ mutual recognition as legitimate members, (2) forbearance, i.e., the exercise of restraint by powerful countries in deploying their institutional and informal prerogatives.
